Between stops, unwind on deck, breathe in the crisp northern air, and take in the striking scenery of these remote Atlantic islands – every day brings a new discovery. Join the full roundtrip or select just the first or second part.



The Ship

**1956 – 2026
70 Years Nordstjernen**

On February 24, 1956, the Blohm & Voss shipyard in Hamburg handed over the MS Nordstjernen to BDS (Det Bergenske Dampskibsselskap). The Nordstjernen was transferred to Bergen and began service on the coastal express route along the Norwegian coast on March 1, 1956.

Day 1: Embarkation in Bergen

The journey begins in Bergen, known for the famous Bryggen district, which is listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The colorful wooden façades reflect the city's long Hanseatic tradition. When you board MS Nordstjernen in the afternoon, you will immediately sense the unique atmosphere of a bygone era. Enjoy the departure through the fjords and prepare for exciting days ahead.

Day 2: Lerwick, Shetland

In Lerwick, the capital of the Shetland Islands, narrow streets, old stone houses, and a lively harbor life await you. Visit the impressive Fort Charlotte and stroll along the bustling waterfront. Lerwick is a vibrant center of Scottish culture and history. After the long crossing last night, the ship will remain in port overnight today – a great opportunity to explore Lerwick's nightlife.

Day 3: Papa Stour, Shetland

This small island impresses with its wild coastal landscape: mighty cliffs, deep caves, and striking rock formations shaped by the sea over millennia. The birdlife is rich and lively – puffins, gulls, and guillemots all nest here. Papa Stour is considered one of the most spectacular parts of Shetland.

Day 4: Vágur, Faroe Islands

MS Nordstjernen sails into Vágur, a charming village on Suðuroy Island, the southernmost of the Faroe Islands. Wander through the village's quaint streets and discover its well-preserved wooden houses and local shops. The surrounding cliffs and open sea offer breathtaking panoramic views, perfect for photography and nature walks. Walk along the harbor to watch local fishing boats at work and feel the serene pace of life here. The MS Nordstjernen remains overnight docked in port.

Day 5: Klaksvík, Faroe Islands

Arrive in Klaksvík, the second-largest town in the Faroe Islands, nestled between steep mountains and fjords. Explore the town center, where small cafés and shops give a taste of daily Faroese life. Visit the local fish market to see the day's catch and experience the town's maritime culture. Walk along the picturesque harbor, enjoy views of the surrounding mountains. As the MS Nordstjernen stays overnight in the port, you have the chance to discover the Faroese nightlife.

Day 6: Elduvík, Faroe Islands

After a scenic sailing along the northernmost Faroese islands, the MS Nordstjernen anchors close to Elduvík, a small and peaceful village on the northeastern coast of Eysturoy Island. The village is framed by dramatic mountains and offers traditional Faroese architecture, making it a perfect spot for photography and quiet reflection. The area is ideal for observing local wildlife and enjoying the harmony of nature and village life. Enjoy another scenic sailing at dinner time, as the MS Nordstjernen turns southwards to Tórshavn.



Day 7a: Tórshavn, Faroe Islands

Spend the day in Tórshavn, the vibrant capital of the Faroe Islands. Explore the old town, Tinganes, with its iconic turf-roofed houses and narrow cobblestone streets. Visit the National Museum to learn about Faroese history and culture and stop by local galleries to see traditional crafts. This is the day when some guests end their voyage with a suitcase full of nostalgic and adventurous memories and new passengers come aboard for the second part of the tour.

Please note: We use tender boats to reach the smaller islands of Papa Stour and Elduvik.

Day 7b: Tórshavn, Faroe Islands

Begin or continue your voyage in Tórshavn, the charming capital of the Faroe Islands. Explore the historic old town with its turf-roofed houses, stroll along the picturesque harbor, and soak in the vibrant local culture before embarking the MS Nordstjernen for your adventure through the Faroese and Shetland islands. Enjoy the first scenic sailing in the late afternoon, when the ship sails northwards and anchors in the bay of Oyndarfjørður.

Day 8: Oyndarfjørður, Faroe Islands

Use the day to explore Oyndarfjørður, a picturesque village on the northern coast of Eysturoy. The area is known for its dramatic cliffs, green valleys, and historical sites. Visit the local church, one of the oldest in the Faroe Islands, whose wooden architecture and ancient gravestones offer a glimpse into local history. Oyndarfjørður is famous for its two rínkusteinar, or rocking stones. At first glance, there is nothing unusual about them, but look closer and you will see that they are in constant motion, rocking back and forth to the rhythm of the waves with the ebbing of the sea. Enjoy the scenery in the late afternoon, when the MS Nordstjernen sails along the stunning cliffs of the Faroese westside.

Day 9: Sørvágur & Bøur, Faroe Islands

Depending on the weather, the MS Nordstjernen will anchor close to the small village of Bøur on Vágur Island or closer to Sørvágur at the inner end of the fjord. Both places offering stunning views of the island's dramatic landscapes when passing the Drangarnir and Tindhólmur cliffs. Spend the day immersed in local craftsmanship or walk along cliffside trails for spectacular panoramic views of the rugged coastline and the Skarðsáfosur waterfall.



Day 10: Tvøroyri, Faroe Islands

In the night MS Nordstjernen arrives in Tvøroyri, a historic harbor town on the east coast of Suðuroy Island. The village has a rich maritime heritage reflected in its well-preserved warehouses, the local maritime museum, and historic trading houses. Explore the narrow streets lined with traditional houses and cozy cafés.

Day 11: Scalloway, Shetland

Spend the day in Scalloway, Shetland's former capital. The village is dominated by the castle (currently under reconstruction), a 17th-century fortress with a dramatic history linked to the Stewart earls. Scalloway was also an important base for the Shetland Bus operation during World War II, serving as a starting point for secret missions between Shetland and occupied Norway.

Day 12: Fetlar, Shetland

Known as "the friendly island," Fetlar is a green island with gentle hills, wide meadows, and quiet bays, visited by MS Nordstjernen in the morning. It is especially renowned for its rich birdlife, including the rare red-necked phalarope. Historical traces, such as ancient settlements, also give the island a special character. In the evening, we set course eastward again.

Day 13: Bergen

Your unforgettable journey ends back in Bergen. Enjoy the last hours on board MS Nordstjernen and take home memories of a sea voyage filled with cultural experiences and unforgettable moments in nature.

Please note: We use tender boats to reach the smaller islands of Oyndarfjørður, Bøur and Fetlar.

How to locate the port

Travelling to the embarkation port and from the disembarkation port must be arranged individually.

Bergen

The berth of MS Nordstjernen is **very easy to reach**:

Train: About a 15-minute walk from Bergen station. Direct trains from Oslo several times a day. Tickets from Oslo to Bergen can be purchased via Vy.no.

Car: Oslo – Bergen is approx. 470 km and about 7 hours' drive. Several parking garages are located near the harbor.

Flight: The nearest airport is Bergen Flesland Airport. From there it takes 30–45 minutes by airport bus or light rail (Bybanen) to Bergen city center.

Ferry: Daily ferry service from Hirtshals to Bergen. Daily coastal route from Kirkenes along the Norwegian coast to Bergen.
